Our Lindsey Fellow Intern, Christine Beach, joined the crowd at the University of Arizona, to welcome Little Amal on her 35 city and town US tour.

Little Amal is the 12 foot puppet of a 10 year old Syrian refugee child at the heart of *The Walk*. She has become a global symbol of human rights, especially those of refugees.

Since July 2021, Amal has travelled over 6,000 miles to 14 countries, and been welcomed by more than a million people.

## Our Rich History

- 1909 | The Collegiate Club of Tucson was organized by a small group of women college graduates.
- 1931 | The Collegiate Club became AAUW Tucson.
- 1946 | AAUW Tucson was one of the five organizing branches that enabled the formation of a state division, AAUW AZ.
- 1965 | 140 members and guests attended the May breakfast meeting. Members brought flowers from their gardens and made table floral arrangements that were sold at the end of the meetings for scholarship funds.
