



AAUW Tucson Branch Celebrates Our 115th Year

From our beginning in 1909, branch members have been generous with their time and funds. A cornerstone for forming the Collegiate Club, now AAUW Tucson, was to establish scholarships.

In historical records, from 1915 by Estelle Luttrell, is a financial report citing \$2.50 per Biology semester; \$6.00 per Chemistry semester; \$23 per month for room and board; and several other entries, all costs for a University of AZ student. Miss Luttrell's report was to fund-raise with the club goal to offer two \$100 UA scholarships. The scholarship were partially funded from the \$3 annual branch membership dues.

Today, AAUW Tucson members continue the tradition of financially supporting local and national scholarships. Over the past twelve months, the branch and members have contributed \$1,078.50 to the AAUW National Greatest Needs Fund.
